




I take a seat next to the man and start asking about his situation. He is new here. He explains about his cancer disease. After receiving treatment, he fell ill with stress. Now, the municipality wants him to start working again. *I'm not ready. Not at all. I'll be going to the municipality today to talk with them.* He looks down and away, out the window. We remain quiet. *I hope your conversation with the municipality turns out well, I note.* He nods and looks down, holding on to his coffee cup.

Albin: [...] You don't have to talk about illness. It can take a while before that happens. But slowly, a subject like that crops up when you are in a Club like this one. I have not felt the need to talk to a psychologist since. That is also what I told you [he looks at me and refers to an informal conversation we had had previously, ed.]. This is my therapy. I don't really think about it. It is enough to come over here and talk to them. It is for me.

George: It's only us who get exhausted by it. [He says this with a straight face, but his eyes are smiling and then he bursts into laughter. Albin also smiles and shakes his head as if he is saying, 'You are teasing me.' Ed.] [...]



We are sitting at tables drinking coffee and eating bread with butter, cheese, and salami. Some of the men are reading papers, while others are chatting. There is a calm atmosphere in the room and the sound of the coffee machine brewing in the nearby kitchen. The door from the hallway opens, and Tim enters. He is wearing a shirt and presentable jeans. He looks as though he has just come out of the shower. His short hair is combed through and looks slightly damp. His face is slightly slimmer than I remember from the last time I saw him. Jack gets up and approaches him with his arms wide open and says, ‘So, you are not dead yet?’ [He has a twinkle in his eye and smiles, ed.]. A huge grin spreads across Tim’s face. They hug each other and pat each other on the back.
